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FFA Funding 2019

Here are 2019's facts and figures hot off the presses from the Market Research & Statistics Department for the FFA's activities to support production, script, distribution, video and exhibition, with the FFA's work from the previous year presented in condensed form and graphs.

The FFA allocated 15.7 million Euros in production funding for 40 projects in 2019. This included 14 international co-productions – almost twice as many as in 2018. The FFA supported the development of 38 screenplays (incl. treatment and further development) with around 1.1 million Euros. The FFA awarded funding and media services totalling 12.4 million Euros for the distribution and world sales of 69 films.


Production

In 2019, members of the FFA Committee for production and script funding deliberated in 7 funding sessions on 112 production applications, 11 more than in 2018. 40 projects – 22 feature films, 8 documentaries and 10 children's films - were supported. This funding quota of 36 per cent was at a similar level to the previous year.

The supported films included "Das perfekte Geheimnis", the most popular German film in 2019, "Undine", Berlinale 2020 Competition entry, and "Jim Button and the Wild 13", the sequel to the most successful German film in 2018. The FFA allocated a total of 15.7, million Euros for production funding – 1.3 million Euros more than in 2018.

Approvals by category

Compared to the previous year, the proportion of supported feature films fell by 7 percentage points to 55 per cent. The proportion of children's films and documentaries has correspondingly grown slightly.



The "Outstanding Films for Children" Initiative

The average production costs for the films supported in 2019 were above those of previous years at 5.30 million Euros.






Production costs by category




Script

The Script Committee supported 26 new screenplay projects in 2019 – 7 more than in the previous year – with a total of 645,000 Euros. This corresponds to a funding quota of 30 per cent for the 88 applications. A total of 60,000 Euros was allocated to support 6 projects – i.e. 12 per cent of the applications – in the funding category for screenplays at treatment stage. 23 applications were submitted to be funded for the further development of a screenplay, with 6 projects being supported. This corresponds to a funding quota of 26 per cent. The FFA allocated around a total of 1.1 million Euros for the development of screenplays in 2019.


Production


The proportion of women producers involved in projects submitted for production funding during 2019 was around the same level – at 13 per cent – as in the previous year, while this fell by 10 and 7 percentage points respectively for women directors and screenwriters to 22 per cent. The proportion of women producers granted funding for their projects increased by 7 percentage points to 18 per cent, but this fell year-on-year by 18 percentage points for women directors and screenwriters to 25 and 23 per cent, respectively.

The proportion of female screenwriters in the funded projects for script and further script development compared to mixed writing teams and male screenwriters is roughly equal at 46 and 50 per cent, respectively; female screenwriters are in the majority for the treatment funding category;





German-French co-productions


The German-French Funding Committee supported 11 out of a total of 27 applications – this corresponds to a funding quota of 41 per cent. 6 projects by up-andcoming producers received 95,000 Euros as part of the project development funding programme.



10 productions funded by the so-called Minitraité were released theatrically in Germany during 2019.

German-Italian Co-Production Development Fund

The FFA and the Italian Ministry for Culture and Tourism (MiBACT) established the German-Italian Co-Production Development Fund to encourage closer collaboration between German and Italian filmmakers.

In 2019, the development of 2 projects – the documentary "Europeana" and the feature film "Con Spirito E Fuoco" – were supported with a total of 30,000 Euros by the German side. The Committee had a total volume of 100,000 Euros at its disposal.


collaboration across borders in the film sector. The fund has a total budget of 55,000 Euros, with the FFA making an annual contribution of 10,000 Euros.

Distribution

In 2019, members of the FFA Committee for distribution, sales and video funding deliberated in 6 funding sessions on 80 applications, of which 41 were supported with a total of 6.8 million Euros. 71 per cent were feature films, 12 per cent for both children's films and documentaries, and 5 per cent animation films. Just under three quarters of the films supported in 2019 had a distribution budget of more than 300,000 Euros. The committee granted sales support of 20,000 Euros for 1 project as way of improving the visibility of German films abroad.


5.6 million Euros were approved for so-called media services, i.e. advertising slots to promote theatrical films on television and radio, which corresponds to a funding quota of 42 per cent. 75 per cent of the funded media services were for feature films, 13 per cent for animation films, 8 per cent for children's films and 4 per cent for documentaries. The Committee awarded a total of 12.4 million Euros in funding, 600,000 Euros less than in 2018.

The distribution companies provided 69.0 per cent via own funds in 2019, almost 5 percentage points above the previous year's total. On average, the FFA provided over one fifth of the financing. The share of the distribution funding programmes administered by the Länder and BKM fell by around 4 percentage points to 10.7 per cent. EU distribution dropped from 0.1 to 0.0 per cent.


Video

The marketing and promotion of German theatrical films on DVD/Blu-Ray was supported by the FFA with 1.6 million Euros in 2019. In addition, just under 30,000 Euros were awarded to 1 joint promotional campaign by video stores. 39 of 57 applications were supported, which corresponds to a funding quota of 68 per cent. Around 63,000 Euros were paid out for the release of films on VoD, with a funding quota of 70 per cent. The possibility of making joint applications for video release and VoD funding was used for 21 applications. A total of 1.7 million Euros was awarded for video and VoD funding measures – 700,000 Euros less than in the previous year.


Repayments

While there was a sharp rise in the repayments
by production, distribution and video companies in
2018 compared to 2017, the repayments in the field
of production and video fell again in 2019.
The repayments for video funding increased by
about 0.4 million Euros in 2019. Producers,
distributors and video companies repaid a total of
more than 4.3 million Euros to the FFA in 2019.



Exhibition (Cinema)

Members of the FFA Committee for cinema funding deliberated in 4 funding sessions about 362 applications for modernisation, expansion and new construction measures - 84 fewer than in 2018. 333 projects were supported; the funding quota of 92 per cent was at the previous year's level. Projects for the creation of barrier-free access were supported with 102,325 Euros.

Applications/Approvals




108 applications for using short films as supporting films and 49 applications for the funding of short film programmes were supported with just under 170.000 Euros, which corresponds to a funding quota of 98 per cent. The FFA allocated a total of 14.2 million Euros for the cinema funding programme in 2019 – 3.7 million Euros less than 2018.



The Funding Programme for Film Heritage

The new funding programme for film heritage (FFE), financed equally by the BKM, the Länder and the FFA, was launched on 1 January, 2019, providing up to 10 million Euros each year for the digitisation of feature films for an initial period of 10 years.


Approvals according to genre

105 projects were supported with 3.0 million Euros in the area of exploitation, 96 projects with 3.4 million Euros for curation, and 36 projects with 1.7 million Euros for conservational necessity. 237 of the 257 applications were approved, including 123 feature films.



Reference Funding

The FFA awards retroactive funding, which can be invested in a new project without any committee decision, for box-office success, participation at festivals or important film awards. The FFA's reference funding benefits producers, distributors and exhibitors. A points system serves as the benchmark for calculating the varying amounts of funding awarded each year.

Short film


In 2019, 58 shorts reached 1,602.50 points, which were worth 570,000 Euros in total – around 356 Euros per point. The productions "Imperial Valley" and "Cat Days", shown, inter alia, in Berlinale Shorts and Generation Kplus at the 69th Berlinale, were particularly successful.

Production

In 2019, the FFA allocated a total of 11.2 million Euros in reference film funding to the producers of 75 commercially and/or cultural particularly successful films. 29.5 million admissions and festival points were generated. This resulted in funding of 38 Cents per sold cinema ticket and festival point. 32 per cent of the available funding budget went to the year's 3 most successful production companies: Constantin Film Produktion, Warner Bros. Film Produktion and Claussen+Putz Filmproduktion.


Distribution

Distributors received a total of around 2.9 million Euros in funding for 70 successful theatrical releases. Around 22.3 million admission points were generated. The funding per cinema ticket sold was set at 13 Cents. 50 per cent of the total was shared among the year's most successful distribution companies: Warner Bros. Entertainment, Sony Pictures Entertainment and Constantin Film Verleih.



Total number of points reached


Total number of points reached

Cinema

A total of 1.9 million Euros in reference cinema funding was allocated to cinema-owners in recognition of box-office success and winning cinema programming awards. Around 27.0 million admission were generated by 592 screens. The funding per admission point was set at 7 Cents. The grants are awarded for the modernisation, improvement and new construction of cinemas.
