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PRODUCTION

165 applications – 57 more than in the previous year – were submitted to the FFA Committee for Production and Script Funding in 2024 for a decision in the area of production. In 6 sessions, the committee members allocated grants to 50 projects, 2 more than in 2023. The funding quota of 30 per cent was a significant 14 percentage points below the previous year's level.

The 50 supported projects comprised 41 feature films and 9 documentaries; 9 fiction feature films and 1 documentary were children's films. The total amount allocated as project film funding was 19.7 million Euros, 0.8 million Euros more than for the previous year.

The directors whose projects received funding include Ali Samadi Ahadi, Wolfgang Becker, Anne Zohra Berrached, Doris Dörrie, Annekatrin Hendel, Sonja Heiss, Michael Bully Herbig, Constanze Klaue, Caroline Link, Ruben Östlund, Christian Petzold, Simon Verhoeven, David Wnendt and Soleen Yusef. The film "Johanna und die Maske der Makonde" by screenwriters Eva Lezzi and Anna Maria Praßler (dir: Nancy Mac Granaky-Quaye) was supported with 300,000 Euros within the framework of the "Outstanding Films for Children" initiative.

PROJECT FILM FUNDING



PRODUCTION APPROVALS BY CATEGORY

As in the previous year, 41 of the 50 projects approved for production funding in 2024 were fiction feature films. The number of funded documentaries rose from 7 to 9, increasing their share by 3 percentage points to 18 per cent. The funding of 18.6 million Euros for fiction feature films was almost half a million Euros more than the amount that had been awarded the previous year; the funding for children's films of around 4.6 million Euros included in this figure remained constant when compared to 2023, as did the total number of 9 supported children's feature films.

One of the 9 documentary films funded in 2024 was also a children's film; the total funding of 1.2 million Euros was 0.4 million Euros more than in 2023.

21 international co-productions, 18 debut films and 1 animated film were supported in the area of production funding.



AVERAGE PRODUCTION COSTS

The average production costs for the projects supported in 2024 – 6.5 million Euros – were slightly above those for the previous year. It was once again the case that many high-budget projects were being supported.



PRODUCTION COSTS BY CATEGORY

Fiction feature films and documentaries both registered an overall increase in production costs. Children's films became on average more expensive, while the production costs for international co-productions remained constant and decreased for debut films.

PRODUCTION

THE MOST SUCCESSFUL FFA-FUNDED FILMS RELEASED IN THE CINEMAS DURING 2024

10.4 million tickets were sold for the 10 most successful films with FFA project funding during 2024, 1.7 million more than in 2023. Two of the supported films posted ticket sales of more than 2.5 million: "School of Magical Animals 3", the year's most popular German film with 2.9 million admissions, and "Chantal in Fairyland".

SUCCESS QUOTIENTS

PRODUCTION AND DISTRIBUTION FUNDING

Of the 213 German films premiering in cinemas during 2024, 77 had received FFA project, script, reference and/or distribution funding – this corresponds to a share of 36 per cent. These films generated 92 per cent of all the tickets sold for German premieres. 34 of the first-runs were made with FFA production and script funding – a share of 16 per cent. They generated 80 per cent of all the cinema tickets sold for German premieres in 2024. The share of films receiving distribution support – a total of 46 titles – was 22 per cent of all the German premieres, and they reached 91 per cent of all cinema-goers. In 2024, films receiving project and distribution funding both posted the highest ever scores since the first recording of success quotients in 2017.

SCRIPT

As with production funding, the number of applications in 2024 for script funding was significantly higher than that in previous years. Of the 297 applications submitted, 72 projects were supported with a total 1.5 million Euros, 12 projects and around 0.2 million Euros more than in the previous year.

The largest share went to the funding of screenplays; a total of 36 projects was supported with 930,000 Euros, 9 projects and 168,000 Euros more than in 2023. The number of supported treatments also increased year-on-year by 3 to 32, with the total funding climbing accordingly to 320,000 Euros. As was the case in the previous year, 4 projects were allocated funding for the further development of screenplays, with the total amount being around 265,000 Euros, an increase of 4,000 Euros. The large volume of applications resulted in a drop in the funding quota for treatments and the further development of screenplays, while it remained constant at 25 per cent for screenplays.

An additional screenplay – "Hugo" by Christoph and Wolfgang Lauenstein – was supported with 25,000 Euros within the framework of the "Outstanding Films for Children" initiative.

SCRIPT-FUNDED PROJECTS WITH THEATRICAL RELEASES IN 2024¹

6 films with script funding from the FFA were released in German cinemas during 2024, including Natja Brunckhorst's comedy "Two To One" which was the opening film of the 41st Munich International Film Festival and attracted around 500,000 cinema-goers after its release in the summer. Julia von Heinz's drama "Treasure" had its world premiere as one of the *Berlinale Special Galas*.

GENDER DISTRIBUTION

PRODUCTION

Women directors are involved in 52 per cent of the supported film projects either with sole responsibility or in a mixed team – i.e. 19 percentage points more than in the previous year. The proportion of women writers and co-writers working on the screenplays of projects receiving production funding also rose by 14 percentage points to 58 per cent. However, the proportion of women producers dropped to 46 per cent, 8 percentage points less than in 2023.



SCRIPT

The proportion of women remains the same year-on-year for all of the three script funding categories. Around 66 per cent of the supported treatments are written by women writers or co-writers, while the figure for screenplays is 56 per cent. Women are involved in 3 out of 4 – i.e. 75 per cent – of the projects receiving support for the further development of screenplays.



INTERNATIONAL CO-PRODUCTIONS

GERMAN-FRENCH

The German-French Funding Committee supported the production of 12 films with a total of 3 million Euros, corresponding to a funding quota of 43 per cent for 28 applications.

The category of project development sees a similar quota (42 per cent), with 5 out of 12 submitted film projects being supported with a total of 175,000 Euros.

Half of the 12 supported co-productions are realised by women directors, 9 films are made with women producers and 7 by women screenwriters. Out of 5 titles receiving funding for project development, women directors, producers and screenwriters are involved in 3 titles, respectively.

MINORITY CO-PRODUCTIONS

Newly established in 2024, the FFA fund for international co-productions with a minority participation from Germany received 20 applications in its first year, of which 5 were then funded with a total of 1 million Euros.

The supported films include new projects by directors Karim Aïnouz, László Nemes and Carla Simón who had all previously won awards at the festivals in Cannes or Berlin.

DISTRIBUTION

The members of the FFA Commission for Distribution, Sales and Video Funding deliberated on 62 applications at 6 meetings, with 49 being allocated distribution funding and 2 sales funding; the funding quota was thus the same as last year at 82 per cent. A total of 9.9 million Euros from FFA funds was used to support the theatrical release or international distribution of 35 fiction feature films, 8 children's films, 2 animated films and 6 documentaries. Around a third of the supported films had a distribution budget of more than 1 million Euros.

In addition, a total of 6.9 million Euros was approved for media services (TV and radio advertising time) for 25 theatrical releases, with the funding quota coming out at 63 per cent. The committee granted a total of around 16.8 million Euros for distribution funding and media services – a significant year-on-year increase of about 2.9 million Euros.

VIDEO

In 2024, the Committee for Distribution, Sales and Video Funding received a total of 34 applications for the release of theatrical films on DVD/Blu-Ray or via video-on-demand, of which 30 were then approved. These are 23 fewer applications and 19 fewer funding approvals than in 2023, a decrease of around 40 and 39 per cent, respectively. The total allocated for video and VoD funding at around 0.7 million Euros was about 201,000 Euros, or 22 per cent, below the previous year's figure.

FUNDING PROGRAMME FOR FILM HERITAGE

In 2024, around 7.7 million Euros was made available for the restoration and digitisation of 217 films from the Funding Programme for Film Heritage (FFE) which had been launched in 2019 by the FFA, BKM and the federal states. The funding committees and the FFA's Board received 265 applications, 73 more than in 2023. The funding quota of 82 per cent was 12 percentage points lower than in the previous year. More than half of the approved projects were fiction feature films. The curatorial interest – in accordance with § 9 of the corresponding guideline¹ – was the most frequent reason for approving digitisation.

CINEMA

The members of the FFA Commission for Cinema Funding deliberated in 3 sessions on 338 applications – 21 more than in 2023 – for modernisation, expansion and new construction measures or plans for re-opening or accessing consulting services for cinemas. 331 projects were supported with around 13.4 million Euros, equivalent to the same funding quota as in the previous year of 98 per cent. As in 2023, the modernisation measures received by far the largest share of the available funding.

The FFA allocated around 13.7 million Euros in total for cinema funding in 2024 – about 2 million Euros less than in 2023.

SHORT FILMS IN CINEMAS

The screening of short films as supporting films or as short film programmes was supported with around 254,000 Euros. All of the 210 applications were approved.

REFERENCE FUNDING

In the period under review, the FFA awarded retroactive funding – which can be used to finance new projects without recourse to a committee decision – for high cinema admissions, participation at festivals or major film awards won during the previous year. The FFA's reference funding goes to production companies, distributors and cinemas. A points system serves as the benchmark for calculating the funding amount which varies from year to year. A film receives a bonus of 25 per cent on top of the generated reference points if its net revenue exceeds the production costs.

PRODUCTION

In 2024, 9.3 million Euros in reference film funding were paid out to the production companies of 68 films which reached a particularly large number of admissions or had success at festivals or won awards in 2023. Each one of around 25.8 million reference points was worth 0.36 Euros. The film "The Three Investigators and The Legacy of the Dragon" generated the largest single amount of funding by posting around 2 million reference points. The most successful production company was Constantin Film Produktion GmbH with 7 films and a total of around 1.9 million Euros.

DISTRIBUTION

German distributors generated around 18.6 million reference points in 2024 from the successful releases of a total of 68 films in 2023. Each point was worth 0.11 Euros, which meant the overall funding paid out was around 2.1 million Euros. Constantin Film Vertriebs GmbH clinched first place among the companies in this section with 8 films.

SHORT FILM

In 2024, 52 short films received a total of 664,500 Euros in reference funding on the basis of festival invitations or awards won during the previous year. A reference point was worth around 502 Euros. The film "Will My Parents Come to See Me" received the largest amount of funding of about 41,400 Euros based on 82.5 reference points.

CINEMA

242 exhibitors with 609 screens received a total of around 2 million Euros in reference funding for the successful presentation of German and European films as well as for cinema programming awards. Each point was worth 0.09 Euros. The most successful exhibitor was Berlin-based Yorck Kino GmbH who generated the most points from 10 screening venues and 29 screens. The screen with the most points in 2023 was Hamburg's Zeise 1.

FESTIVALS AND AWARDS IN 2024

30 funded films screening in the various sections, with five of them in the *Competition*: FFA-funded films had a strong showing in the 74th Berlinale's programme. The dramas "From Hilde, With Love" by Andreas Dresen and "Dying" by Matthias Glasner – both recipients of FFA project film funding – were competing for the Golden Bear. The *Competition* also featured the German-French documentary "Architecton" by Victor Kossakovsky and the science fiction satire "The Empire" by Bruno Dumont – both produced with support from the German-French Minitraité programme – as well as the drama "Langue Étrangère" by Claire Burger, which was produced with reference film funding from the FFA. The awards ceremony saw Bruno Dumont taking home the Silver Bear – Jury Prize, while Matthias Glasner received the Silver Bear for Best Screenplay.

The French-German-Belgian co-production "Ghost Trail" by Jonathan Millet, made with Minitraité funding, opened the *Semaine de la Critique* at the 77th Festival de Cannes, while its Italian counterpart, the *Settimana Internazionale della Critica* at the 81st Mostra in Venice, screened Bernhard Wenger's Austrian-German comedy "Peacock". The Lido was also the backdrop for the world premieres of Andres Veiel's documentary "Riefenstahl" in an *Out Of Competition* screening and Tim Fehlbaum's drama "September 5" as the opening film of the *Orizzonti Extra* sidebar. All three films premiering in Venice had received FFA project film funding.

The festivals in Berlin, Cannes and Venice also presented screenings of films that had been restored with support from the Funding Programme for Film Heritage; no less than 11 films were shown at the Berlinale in the *Forum, Retrospective* and *Berlinale Classics* sections. 40 years after winning the Golden Palm, Wim Wenders returned to Cannes to present his masterpiece "Paris, Texas" in a restored 4K version which then travelled to festivals and cinemas on almost every continent and posted another 1 million Euros globally.

The opening film of the 41st Munich International Film Festival – Natja Brunckhorst's "Two to One" – was just one of 14 films with funding from the FFA to be shown at the festival in 2024. Films supported by the FFA were also invited to numerous international festivals during the year, including Annecy, Busan, Karlovy Vary, Locarno, Sundance and Tribeca. Germany was the focus country at the 28th Tallinn Black Nights Film Festival; nearly 50 German (co-)productions were shown, including the festival's opening film, David Dietl's "Long Story Short", and another 14 FFA-funded films. Other country focuses with FFA-funded films were also held in Bengaluru, Hanoi and Trieste, among others, during 2024.

Several awards went to FFA-funded productions at the 74th German Film Awards: 4 prizes – including the Lola in Gold – for Matthias Glasner's "Dying", 2 each for Steffi Niederzoll's documentary "Seven Winters in Tehran" and Simon Verhoeven's band portrait "Girl You Know It's True", 1 each for Chris Kraus's drama "15 Years", Tim Dünschede's box-office hit "The Three Investigators and The Legacy of the Dragon" and Soleen Yusef's "Winners", which was made within the framework of the "Outstanding Films for Children" initiative.

Soleen Yusef's "Winners" also won the Kindertiger screenplay prize sponsored by the FFA. In 2024, the FFA's SHORT TIGER AWARD was presented to the shorts "Black Youth" by Isaac Martínez, "The Bard's Curse" by Scarlett Unverricht, "Enjoy Your Meal" by Sofie Kienzle and Christian Manzke, "Superbuhei" by Josef Brandl, and "The Hidden Dimension" by Ben Galster.

FOREIGN SALES IN 2024

TOP 10 - INTERNATIONAL PERFORMANCE OF FILMS WITH FFA PRODUCTION FUNDING

Half of the 10 top-grossing FFA-funded films abroad are children's films, and the cinemas around the globe mostly show co-productions from Germany. The German-Finnish-Irish-Danish animated film "Niko – Beyond The Northern Lights" by Kari Juusonen and Jørgen Lerdam, which grossed 8.7 million Euros in 35 territories outside of Germany, falls into both categories. The British-German co-production "The Outrun" by Nora Fingscheidt, which was shown at Sundance and the Berlinale, grossed around 5 million Euros in 8 territories.

The German-French co-production "Treasure" by Julia von Heinz and three films aimed at a young audience – "Butterfly Tale", "Lassie – A New Adventure" and "Animal Tales of Christmas Magic" – racked up 10 or more international cinema releases.
